

Supporting Arts Practitioner

The Malta Trust Foundation is seeking the services of a Supporting Arts Practitioner who will actively participate in the delivery and preparation of a pilot project giving access to the Arts to children and young people with disability.

Interested applicants will be receive Euro 18.00 per hour for their services. A weekly commitment of 3 hours will be considered is necessary. The workshops will be taking place every Tuesday between 16:00 and 19:00

Requirements

The Supporting Arts Practitioner will be required to:

- Have previous experience working with children and young people with disability.
- Possess proper art related qualifications or experience to carry out such duties.

General Services

The Supporting Arts Practitioner will be required to:

- Assist main researchers in the planning, execution and delivery of VB Art Beat programme for small groups of service users with diverse educational needs.
- Contribute to the learning activities and teaching programmes for service users with diverse educational needs.
- Liaise with project coordinator, arts research practitioner, trainees or volunteers both within the premises and off-site.
- Undertake other reasonable duties as directed by the consultant / representative of the Foundation.
- Show awareness of and comply with all policies and procedures of the Foundation, in particular those related to the Villabianca project.
- Contribute to the overall ethos, aims and work of the Malta Trust Foundation / Villabianca by establishing and supporting constructive professional relationships.
- Attend participate in relevant meetings as required.

Specific duties

The Supporting Arts Practitioner will be required to:

- Safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people.
- Attend Tuesday afternoon weekly sessions (between 16:00 and 19:00) held in St Venera.
- Actively Participate in the delivery and preparation of this pilot programme .

- Support researchers in updating the weekly report following art sessions.
- Co-work and/or Lead art sessions.
- Ensure the accurate observations and records of all work are kept securely as part of this research phase.
- Ensure absolute hygiene of materials and equipment.
- Attend any meetings that are required by the Foundation for the effective implementation of the project, as well as its longevity based on the findings.

Support for service users

The Supporting Arts Practitioner will be required to:

- Ensure service users' safety.
- Promote the active participation, self-confidence and self-determination of each service user making part of this project.
- Establish positive relationships with service users, acting as a good role model.
- Assist researchers in the writing of a final report on each group to support the research element of this project.
- Prepare, maintain and use materials and resources and assist service users in their use.
